



CHARLES N. AGREE OUTPOST MEDICATION AND CLINIC PROCEDURES



MEDICATIONS AT CAMP:

- Place all medications (including OTC) into a Ziploc bag, marked with the camper's name and give to the Med's Collector the morning of departure.
- Send medications in their original containers only.
- Remember to include with medications the name, dose, and specific directions. If you want us to follow directions that are different from those written on the bottle, please indicate that clearly.
- We routinely administer medications before meals and at bedtime. This may be different from the times you use at home. To avoid disruptions in your child's daily schedule the staff may need to make slight adjustments in medication administration times.
- We strongly suggest that, if your child uses inhalers daily, you send up an extra, which will be stored in the medical area.
- There is no need to send over the counter medications to camp. We have them in stock and will be happy to provide them. Please list them on the medical form and/or instruction sheet with other medications.
- Please send enough medication for your child's stay. We will make every effort to return all unused medications and equipment.
- If your child wears glasses we strongly suggest sending a spare pair of glasses.

THE CAMP DIRECTOR WILL NOTIFY PARENTS BY PHONE IF:

- Your child is prescribed any prescription drug.
- Your child needs to be taken to a doctor or hospital for examinations, x-rays or tests.
- Your child has a temperature over 101° for over 24 hours.

Due to the fact that doctors and medical facilities in Northern Ontario do not accept US insurance, a bill will be sent to you at the end of the summer for any medications, hospital or doctor's visits your child may have received while at camp. You will need to send a copy of your expenses to your insurance carrier and they will reimburse you.

PARENTS WILL NOT BE NOTIFIED IF:

Your child receives routine diagnosis and treatment by the local doctor or nurse for cuts, colds, insect bites, rashes, sore throat, etc.
